TROPHIES

BLANESBURGH PERPETUAL SILVER CHALLENGE CUP

Presented by

The Late The Right Hon. Lord Blanesburgh, C.B.E.

The Cup to be a Points Prize, to be awarded annually to the exhibitor scoring the highest number of points in the Horse, Cattle and Sheep Sections of the show. Points to be awarded as follows: First, 3 points; Second, 2 points; Third, 1 point. Full points will be awarded only when there are three or more competitors in each class. If there are less than three competitors in any one class, then half-points will be scored by each Prize Winner in that class.

NOTE- Classes for Special Prizes are excluded in assessing points.

LOGIE & LECROPT PLOUGHING SOCIETY TROPHY

A Special Prize for the Exhibitor gaining most points. A Perpetual Trophy presented in 1971 by Logie & Lecropt Ploughing Society to be awarded to the Exhibitor gaining most points in each section in rotation. 2008 Cattle Section.

NOTE- Classes for Special Prizes are excluded in assessing points.

THE DRUMMORE TROPHY

A Perpetual Trophy for the best animal in section. Presented to the Society in memory of the late Tom McLaren, Chairman 1960-66, to be awarded for the best Animal in each breed, commencing with the Clydesdales in 1967, thereafter annually for each breed in schedule order. 2008 Shetland Ponies.

THE EWAN M BEATON TROPHY

A Perpetual Trophy presented by the Beaton Family for the Best Brood Mare in the Light Legged Horse Section. From 2005, this trophy will now be presented to the winner of the Open Hunter Class in the HORSES UNDER SADDLE SECTION.

ALISTAIR STEWART MEMORIAL TROPHY

A Perpetual Trophy presented in 1994 for the Clydesdale Female Section, to be awarded annually in schedule order. 2008 Mare, brood, to foal this season or with foal at foot.

Grand Parade of Prize Animals and Presentation of Cups etc. approx 1.30pm.

Animals winning 1st, 2nd and 3rd Prize in Cattle, Horses of Scottish Native Breeds and Goat Sections and 1st and 2nd in Pony Sections and Champions and Reserve Champions (unless where excused) must parade under penalty of forfeiture of Prizes.

NO STOCK TO BE REMOVED FROM SHOWYARD BEFORE 3.30PM.

Note Members and Exhibitors admitted free to Show yard, but must pay for parking their cars. Stock attendants will be admitted with INDIVIDUAL PASSES ONLY. No refunds will be given where passes have been mislaid.

1 lorry pass will be issued to each exhibitor. Any additional vehicles will have to pay £5 to park in the Light Horse Field or £3 to park in the Main Car Park.

NOTE TO MEMBERS AND EXHIBITORS

1. Subscriptions for the present year are now due. Members who have not already paid should remit to the Secretary, so that the list of Members may be completed. People may call at the Secretary's Office in the Showground, where subscriptions may be paid. Members are entitled to free admission to the Show.
2. Members are requested to endeavour to obtain new members, so as to enable the Society to extend and improve. The Annual Subscription is £7-50.
3. **PENS** It is hoped to provide pens for mares with foals but unfortunately only in the Shetland & Highland Pony Sections. No charge is made. Availability, however, is not guaranteed. Pens will not be available for any other Pony Classes.
4. Provision will be made for the appropriate segregation of Accredited Sheep and CAE Accredited Goats.
5. There will be **no** provision made for the segregation of IBR cattle.
6. **PENNING** The tickets and numbers for Pens for Stock and Exhibits will be issued to Exhibitors on the Show morning by the Secretary. Exhibitors and Members are requested to note that all Stock and other Exhibits must be in their places not later than 9.00am. except where otherwise mentioned on the Show morning. **NO STOCK TO BE REMOVED BEFORE 3.30PM.** Additional Entry Forms, Schedules etc. from the Secretary.
7. Judging to commence at 8.30am. for Working Hunter class, 9.00am. for Light Horses and Clydesdales and 9.30am. for Cattle, Sheep, Goats, Shetland Ponies & Highland Ponies unless otherwise stated.
8. 2007 Trophies to be returned to the Secretary by 21st June 2008.
9. **NOTE:** Only Trophies marked with an asterisk (*), WRI Cups and Trade Stand Shields will be presented on the Show Field at the time of the Parade.
10. Trophies can be collected from the Secretary's Tent after the Grand Parade.
11. Alistair Smith, Official Show Farrier, will be on site all day.

NOTICE TO EXHIBITORS AND THE PUBLIC AS TO THE SOCIETY'S LIABILITY IN SHOWGROUND AND CAR PARK

The Society and its Officers and Employees shall not be responsible to any persons whatsoever, whilst upon the Showground or while entering or leaving the same, for any damage or loss, however caused, to the property of any such person or for any injury, fatal or otherwise, to any such person. The Society and its Officers and Employees, shall not be responsible for any accident or loss, however caused, that may occur to any exhibitor or his employee or to any animal, article or property brought into the Showground or while entering or leaving or being carried into or out of the said Showground. Each exhibitor shall be solely responsible for any loss, injury or damage that may be done to or occasioned by or arising from any animal, article or property exhibited or brought into the Showground by him/her and he/she shall indemnify and hold harmless the Society from and against all actions, suits, expenses and claims on account of or in respect of any such damage or injury which may be so caused or occasioned.

REGULATIONS

1. All animals and exhibits must be bona-fide property of the Exhibitors (unless where contrary is necessarily implied) and be in the Exhibitor's keep since 1st May before the day of the Show. Joint ownership must be declared and for animals to be eligible for confined prizes, all owners must reside within the confined area. Bulls must be led during the exhibition.
2. Brucellosis-Cattle from herds that are not under any restrictions may enter the Show.
3. The age of stock shall count from 1st January. Pedigree Beef Cattle shall count from 1st August, except where stated in the class.
4. In the Cattle Section, one-year-olds must show no broad teeth and two-year-olds must show broad teeth only and the person in charge must show the animal's teeth when asked by the Judge or Steward.
5. In Blackface Sheep Classes, all rams and hogs must be clipped after 1st April in the Show year. Ewes to be shown rough or clipped except where specified in Schedule.

6. Any artificial contrivance or device of any description found on or proved to have been used on an animal, either for preventing the flow of milk or for any other improper purposes, will disqualify that animal from being awarded a prize and the owner of any said animal may be prohibited from again entering stock for any of the Society's Shows for such a period as the Society may see fit.
7. No Member shall be allowed to bring stock onto the ground, which has had any notifiable disease in his stock within a period of three months prior to the day of the Show.
8. No person shall be allowed within the ring while the Judges are making their awards Stewards and Assistant Stewards excepted. No person shall in any way interfere with or obstruct any Judge, Steward or Assistant Steward of the Show while in the execution of their duty.
9. Animals obtaining First prizes at this Show in any single entry class, with the exception of Highland Ponies, Pony Club Pony, Mountain and Moorland Ponies and Clydesdale Harness Section, shall not be allowed to compete at this year's Show in any other single entry class Championship Cups and Special Prizes being excepted.
10. Except in the Grand Parade and Championship Classes, no animal shall be allowed in the Judging Ring with a prize ticket attached.
11. A Steward and at least one Assistant Steward, if appointed by the Directors, shall attend each section of Judges. It will be their duty to see that no obstruction is offered to them and that the space reserved for them is not encroached upon; to ticket the Prize Animals; to assist the Judge in every necessary respect; to see that the Judge's book is properly entered up and returned to the Secretary; and should any difficulty arise, to communicate with the Chairman, Vice-Chairman or Secretary.
12. The Society will not be liable in respect of any claim for loss, injury, or damage which any stock, article or person may sustain from accident or otherwise at or in connection with the Show.
13. The Show is subject to the Orders issued by SEERAD and other Authorities and it is the responsibility of exhibitors to comply with these. All forms for Accredited Stock: CAE; MAEDI VISNA & SCRAPIE MUST BE RETURNED WITH ENTRY FORMS AND A COPY GIVEN TO YOUR STEWARD ON THE SHOW DAY BEFORE ANIMALS CAN BE UNLOADED. Details of the regulations can be had from the Secretary.
14. No protests will be received unless lodged in writing giving particulars with the Secretary within 7 days of date of Show along with a deposit of £10-00 for each protest, which will be forfeited if the objection is over-ruled. The Committee shall have full power to settle all disputes, questions, differences and claims arising at or in connection with the Show and their decision shall be final and binding on all parties. The Chairman, failing whom the Vice-Chairman, shall have power to convene at any time an emergency committee meeting on the Show Ground to dispose of any matter that he may consider urgent.
15. Cups (or other prizes) in competition for more than one year must be returned to the Secretary's Office by the winner, holder or custodian for the time being, at least fourteen days prior to the forthcoming Show. Such winner, holder or custodian shall by taking delivery of a cup or other prize, be responsible for its proper care, safe custody and due return and shall be required by the Committee, at any time, to find security for its care, safe custody and return. Such winners, etc., shall remain responsible until they obtain acknowledgement of due return from the Secretary.
16. Members' Subscriptions and Entry Money must be paid to the Secretary before or when entry of stock etc. is made. No exhibit can be shown until such dues are paid. The Annual Subscription is £7-50.
17. **ENTRIES CLOSE ON SATURDAY 14TH JUNE 2008. NO ENTRIES ACCEPTED AFTER THAT DATE EXCEPT FOR LIGHT HORSE, HIGHLAND & SHETLAND PONY SECTIONS CAN ENTER ON THE DAY OF THE SHOW. THE REGULATION WILL BE ENFORCED AT THE SHOW DIRECTORS DISCRETION. ALL ENTRIES MUST BE IN WRITING.**
18. No animals may be entered for a Championship and Special Prizes unless entered in a Class in that Section.
19. This Show is affiliated to BSPS, Ponies UK, CHAPS (UK), Shetland Pony Stud Book, Clydesdale Horse Society, Highland Pony Society and British Driving Society and these Society's rules must be obeyed.
20. Any Member found guilty of wilfully breaking any foregoing regulations will forfeit all claim to any prizes and may be excluded from membership of the Society.
21. Competitors entering in more than one section (where not otherwise specifically prohibited) accept the risk that timing may prohibit them so competing.
22. Any Brood Mare losing foal will automatically qualify for the Yield Mare Class where applicable.
23. Any animal not under control of handler or rider MUST if asked by a Show Director or Steward leave the ring immediately.
24. **CATTLE PASSPORTS:** Passports must accompany all cattle to the show by order of SEERAD.
25. Exhibitors MUST wear the appropriate numbers in the correct class to avoid confusion when judging and in result books. Failure to comply with this rule may result in the Exhibitor being disqualified.
26. White coats or smart dress must be worn.
27. **SHEEP SECTION: SCRAPIE DECLARATION:** Sheep exhibitors must comply with the following: 1. All females of all breeds except Dorset Horn, Polled Dorset & Finnish Landrace to be entered and exhibited are: (a) Non pregnant (empty) (b) Have not lambed within 30 days prior to the Show (c) Not subject to procedures which change the seasonal breeding patterns.

*** In the event of new animal health legislation being enacted between now and the date of the Show, exhibitors will be expected to abide by any new conditions of that legislation.**

Class 17 - CALF, EITHER SEX: Beef, any breed, 1 year old and under on day of the Show. Shown by girl or boy over 8 and under 14 yrs inclusive, who must be accompanied by an adult stockperson. This class will be judged solely on the handlers performance. Any animal not under the control of the handler

will be asked to leave the ring at the Steward's discretion. This Class to be judged by a Beef Judge, this year the Charolais Cattle Judge. This Class is not eligible for any Championship. Trophy from the SCOTTISH SIMMENTAL CLUB for the winner, shield for reserve. (ENTRY REQUIRED/NO ENTRY MONEY REQUIRED. ENTRY WILL ALSO BE ACCEPTED ON THE DAY).
