In order to receive your entry number, you must present your Cattle Passports at the Secretary's tent prior to showing.

For any movement to a Show the owner of the animal must complete the 'SELLERS' part of the movement box in the normal way.

Details of the SHOW should be entered in the relevant 'MARKET' box by the keeper of the animal. The movement from the SHOW back to the holding should then be recorded in the 'BUYERS' part of the movement box again by the keeper of the show.

IMPORTANT RULE Any animal coming from a Scottish holding must have a 'negative' herd status for BVD or be individually tested negative for the BVD virus. Any animal from a 'not negative' herd cannot move to a show unless it has been individually tested negative for the BVD virus. Any animal coming from outside Scotland should either be from a BVD CHECS accredited herd or be individually tested negative for the BVD virus. PLEASE UPLOAD CERTIFICATION IF AVAILABLE at time of entries.

Class 12 - CALF, EITHER SEX, Holstein/Friesian, 1 year old or under on the day of the Show. Shown by child aged 10 years and under, who must be accompanied by an adult stockperson. Any animal not under the control of the handler will be asked to leave the ring. This Class to be judged by the Dairy Judge. This Class not eligible for any Championship. A Trophy will be awarded to the winner (ENTRY REQUIRED/NO ENTRY MONEY REQUIRED). This class will be judged immediately after the Holstein/Friesian/AOB Championship has taken place.

Class 13- CALF, EITHER SEX, Holstein/Friesian, 1 year old or under on the day of the Show. Shown by child aged between 10-14 years, who must be accompanied by an adult stockperson. Any animal not under the control of the handler will be asked to leave the ring. This Class to be judged by the Dairy Judge. This Class not eligible for any Championship. A Trophy will be awarded to the winner (ENTRY REQUIRED/NO ENTRY MONEY REQUIRED). This class will be judged immediately after the Holstein/Friesian/AOB Championship has taken place.

Class 14 - CALF, EITHER SEX: Beef, any breed, 1 year old and under on day of the Show. Shown by child aged 8 years to 14 years old inclusive, who must be accompanied by an adult stockperson. This class will be judged solely on the handler's performance. Any animal not under the control of the handler will be asked to leave the ring at the Steward's discretion. This Class to be judged by the Beef Judge. This Class is not eligible for any Championship. Trophy for the winner. (ENTRY REQUIRED/NO ENTRY MONEY REQUIRED). This class will be judged after the Interbreed Championship has taken place.
