HORSES & PONIES RULES

- HORSE PASSPORTS MUST BE BROUGHT TO THE SHOW.
- BSPS Affiliation Number 2026-S-008. This Show is affiliated to the BSPS. All persons entering, competing, showing or otherwise taking part in BSPS and affiliated classes, whether or not members of BSPS, are subject to the rules of the BSPS including the disciplinary procedures, and shall be deemed to have consented to the jurisdiction of the BSPS.
- Please see www.bspscotland.co.uk for full Rulebook.
- In all classes affiliated to BSPS, the BSPS rules take precedence.
- All classes open to non-members of the BSPS.
- Entries in all ridden classes born in or before 2022.
- Brood mares to be four years old and over and foal at least three weeks old.
- Rider's date of birth as at 1st of January in the current year.
- Correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats Nos. PAS015 2011, VG1, (BS) EN1384 2023, ASTM F1163 2015 and 2023, SNELL E2016 and E2021 onwards, MUST be worn by riders at all times when mounted. Hats should have a plain cover, either Black, Navy Blue, Brown, Grey or Green. Velvet covers are encouraged. The B.S.P.S. encourages members to have their hats tagged through the B.S.P.S. scheme or via the Pony Club Scheme. Tagging indicates the hat meets the accepted standards, no check of the fit or condition of the hat is implied. It is considered to be the responsibility of the members/guardians to ensure the hat complies with current standards and is tagged before they compete. Members/guardians are responsible for ensuring the manufacturer's guidelines with regard to fit and replacement are followed.
- Body Protectors MUST be worn when jumping in any WHP and WH classes, Including practice rings at B.S.P.S. affiliated shows. (Including Tiny Tots, Cradle and Nursery Stakes, WSP, LRWSP and Training Stakes). Riders must wear a body protector when working in (practice jumps) and the jumping phase in all B.S.P.S. organised and affiliated events. A British Equestrian Trade Association (BETA) approved and appropriately labelled "Level 3 body protector" 2018 (Blue) shown on the label. BETA recommends body protectors are replaced at least every three to five years, after which the impact absorption properties of the foam may have started to decline.
- Air Jackets may be worn. If a member chooses to wear an air jacket they are allowed in addition to a normal body protector, which meets BETA 2018 level 3 standard. Air jackets must not be worn under any jacket or body protector and numbers must be fitted with elasticated fastenings. When an air jacket inflates the sudden noise can startle horses, thereby, causing difficulties for other members if used in confined areas, eg, indoor schools and ménage's. Therefore, air jackets are not encouraged to be used in those areas except for medical reasons.
- The wearing of spurs in ALL classes held und B.S.P.S. Rules is forbidden and competitors must adhere to BSPS rule 52 on appropriate use of the whip.

THE B.S.P.S. THOR ATKINSON STEEL FABRICATIONS LTD CHALLENGE

- This show is a qualifier for the B.S.P.S. Challenge. Animals competing in the following Open classes will qualify, Open Lead Rein Show Pony, First Ridden Show Pony, Lead Rein of Hunter Type, Show Pony, SHP, Cradle and Nursery Stakes, WHP, Intermediates and Open Heritage Lead Rein, First Ridden, Ridden and WHP classes.

THE B.S.P.S. ANTHONY EVANS INSURANCE CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS

- This show is a qualifier for the B.S.P.S. Binks Family Champion of Champions the 1st prize winners in the following classes will qualify: Open Lead Rein, First Ridden, Open Show Ponies, Open WHP, Open SHP, Open LRHT, Open Intermediate SH, SRT and WH and Open Heritage Lead Rein, First Ridden, Ridden and WHP Classes.

THE B.S.P.S. ANTHONY EVANS INSURANCE MINI WHP CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS

- This show is a qualifier for The B.S.P.S. Mini WHP Champion of Champions the 1st prize winners in Open Cradle and Nursery Stakes will qualify.

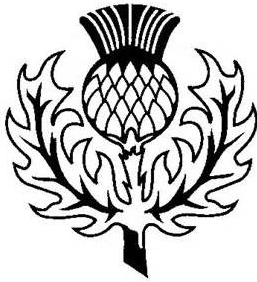
To be run under NPS SCOTLAND CHAMPIONSHIPS RULES 2026.

These rules clarify areas particular to NPS Scotland. We also run to the Rules of the National Pony Society.

Exhibitors are deemed to be conversant with these rules.

A judge is not obliged to award an NPS Scotland Qualification if he/she feels that the pony is not of a sufficient standard.



Caledonian Showing Championships

This show is a qualifier for the Caledonian Showing Championships, which is now fully established as the biggest and best way to end Scottish showing season.

This year's show will be held at:

Howe EC, near Ladybank, Fife on 16/17/18 October 2026

Every horse & pony placed 1st in all In hand, Ridden Showing classes (not fun classes) & Working Hunter/Pony classes will qualify to compete in any appropriate class at the Finals. All Champions & Reserves will qualify for the Champion & Reserves Stakes Finals. Qualification will be from placings, no qualification cards will be awarded in the ring, and no qualification can go down the line. All qualified horses and ponies will be listed on the Puddledub Show's Facebook page and <https://puddledub.entrymaster.online/>

Irish Draught Horse Society (GB)

This show is affiliated to the Irish Draught Society (GB) and as such all exhibitors in classes 8-12 must be eligible under the below criteria: -

GENERAL ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- All horses must be registered with or over stamped by the IDHS (GB) and in the correct ownership
- Owners of Pure-Bred Irish Draughts and Irish Draught Sport Horse (Part Bred) must be full members of the IDHS (GB) to compete
- Irish Draught Part Breds (Sport Horse) are horses that have a minimum of 25% proven Irish Draught breeding
- Ridden horses must be 153cm (15hh) or over.
- in hand breeding classes
 - MARES with foals at foot, 3 years and over must be inspected and classified as Class 1 (or RID), Class 2 or Supplementary Grade Up (or AID)
 - Pure Bred youngstock must be the progeny of an inspected Mare (Class 1, Class 2, RID (GB), AID or Supplementary Grade Up Register) and be by a Class 1, 2 or RID (GB) stallion on the Irish Draught Breed Register.
 - Pure Bred ID and ID Part Bred (Sport Horse), 3-year-old colts must be un-inspected
 - All 1-, 2- & 3-year-old colts must be bitted and shown by an experienced handler over 18 years of age
- All Pure-Bred Irish Draught Stallions
 - must be inspected and over stamped by the IDHS (GB) and be Class 1, 2 or RID (GB).
 - Stallions must display a red, white and blue ribbon in their tails and be shown by an experienced rider/handler over 18 years of age

- The Finals of all IDHS (GB) qualifiers will be held at the IDHS (GB) National Championship Show on 5th & 6th September 2026 at Pickering Grange Equestrian, Pickering Grange Farm, Ellistown, Terrance Road, Coalville, LE67 1EZ.
- All owners of qualified horses will be contacted by a member of the IDHS (GB) Show Affiliation Team
- Horses can only qualify for a specific Final once, regardless of the type or number of classes won, placed in or entered

Judging not before 1.30pm.

**Judges – (Conformation) Mrs Lyn McFadzean, Perthshire
(Ride) Miss Erin Donnelly, Perthshire**

Course Builder – Mrs Carrie Scobbie, Clackmannanshire

For Class 001:

Maximum height of jumps – 85cm

No boots, bandages, spurs or whips over 30".

Boots only in the jumping phase.

For Class 002:

Maximum height of jumps – 95cm

No boots, bandages, spurs or whips over 30".

Boots only in the jumping phase.

For Class 003:

Perth Equine Vets/BHS Scotland Working Hunter Series 2026

The horse must be four years old and over, exceeding 148cm (14.2hh approx.). The rider must be a member of the British Horse Society by the time of the Championship. Riders must be eighteen years or over on the day of the championship.

Qualification: The first three will qualify for the final, even if they did not jump clear. If one of those three has already qualified, the qualification may be handed down to the fourth placed horse and rider provided they jumped clear.

This competition series is run under Sport Horse Breeding of Great Britain (SHB (GB) the governing body of all hunter and sports horses classes) it is the responsibility of competitors to be familiar with these rules; they can be found at <http://www.sporthorsegb.co.uk>

Please be aware of rules:

50 H - All ridden hunters in classes where the Judge rides the exhibits must be shod all round. No pads or surgical shoes are allowed.

50i - No hind boots or bandages of any description are allowed in the collecting ring, warm up or in the actual class in Working Hunter and Ridden Sport Horse classes.

50 j - The Society discourages the showing of over fat horses and Judges will take this into consideration when making their awards.

The Course: At least 8 and not more than 12 fences, with changes of direction, must be set in a ring large enough to permit jumping fluently at a fair hunting pace. Fences should be rustic or as natural as possible, not easily dislodged, of solid appearance, well filled and with shrubs as wings. Maximum height 3ft 6ins (1.05m), maximum spread 3ft 9ins (1.12m), except open ditch and water. The course should be set at, or near, maximum unless the judge considers that the ground makes this unsafe. Normally at least one upright and one spread must be at maximum. **If there is a class prior to this class at your show, there should be a change in track made.**

Class 001 – Novice Working Hunter, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over exceeding 148cm (14.2hh). Riders to have attained their 16th birthday by the day of the show. Jumps not exceeding 85cm.

Class 002 – Intermediate Working Hunter, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over exceeding 148cm (14.2hh). Riders to have attained their 16th birthday by the day of the show. Jumps not exceeding 95cm.

Class 003 – Open Working Hunter, (Perth Equine Vets/BHS Scotland Open Working Hunter 2026) Horses 4 years old and over exceeding 148cm (14.2hh). Riders to have attained their 18th birthday by the day of the show. Jumps not exceeding 105cm.

1st & 2nd prize winners eligible for Ridden Horse Championship.

LIGHT HORSE BREEDING – IN HAND – Ring 4

Judging starts at 8.30am.

Class 004 - Brood mare exceeding 153cm with foal at foot or to foal by 31st July 2025

Class 007 – Mare or gelding four years old and over, in hand.

Championship – 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 004, 005, 006 & 007 are eligible for the Light Horse In-Hand Championship.

IRISH DRAUGHTS – Ring 4

Judging To Follow Light Horse Breeding

Judge – Mrs D Richardson-Rowell, Ayrshire (Conformation)

Mr. William Pittendrigh, Northumberland (Ride)

This show is affiliated to the Irish Draught Horse Society (GB) and as such horses entered in Classes 008 – 012 should be eligible under the criteria set out on Page 2 of this schedule.

The Irish Draught Owners & Breeders Group Youngstock challenge

This show is a Qualifier for The Irish Draught Owners & Breeders Group Youngstock Challenge. The two highest placed Pure-Breds from each age group not already qualified in Classes 09 and 010 will qualify. If one or both have already qualified, the horse next in line in each age group will qualify. Horses entered into this class must be eligible under the criteria listed on page 2 of this schedule.

At the final, there will be three preliminary classes with the two highest placed semi-finalists from each class going forward to the Championship. The Champion will receive £500 and the Reserve Champion £150.

IDHS (GB) £2000 Ridden Challenge

This show is a qualifier for the £2,000 Ridden Challenge jointly sponsored by the IDHS (GB) and Yorkshire Irish Draught & Hunter Show. The highest placed horse (not already qualified) from class 011 and class 012 will qualify for the final.

In the Final, the Champion will be awarded £1,000 prize money, the Reserve Champion will be awarded £500 and 3rd to 7th inclusive will be awarded £100 each. In addition, the highest placed Purebred Irish Draught will receive £100, and the highest placed Irish Draught Part Bred will receive £50.

Class 008 - Irish Draught & Irish Draught Sport Horse/ Part Bred Maturity In-hand - four years old and over, stallion, mare (mares with foal at foot are NOT eligible to enter this class. They should be barren or in foal only) or gelding registered on the Irish Draught / Irish Draught Sports Horse Breed Register

Class 009 - Irish Draught Youngstock - Yearling, two- and three-year-old filly, colt or gelding by a Class 1, 2 or RID (GB) sire out of a Graded dam, (three-year-old colts must be un-inspected)

Class 010 - Irish Draught Sport Horse / Part bred Youngstock - Yearling, two and three year old filly, gelding or colt either by a Class 1, 2 or RID (GB) sire out of an inspected Irish Draught dam or, ID Part Bred of at least 25% proven Irish Draught Breeding

Class 011 - Ridden Irish Draught - 4 years old and over, mare, stallion or gelding, registered on the Irish Draught Breed Register or over stamped with the IDHS (GB)

Class 012 – Ridden Irish Draft Sport Horses/Part Bred - 4 years old and over, mare, stallion or gelding, registered on the Irish Draught Sport Horse Register or over stamped with the IDHS (GB)

*H2 – IRISH DRAUGHT CHAMPIONSHIP – 1st and 2nd prize winners from classes 008-012 are eligible for the Irish Draught Championship.

RIDDEN HORSE – Ring 4

To follow Irish Draughts, NOT BEFORE 11AM

**Judges – (Conformation) Mrs Lyn McFadzean, Perthshire
(Ride) Miss Erin Donnelly, Perthshire**

A Novice Horse is a horse that has not won a 1st prize prior to 1st January in the Show year.

Open to mares and gelding exceeding 14.2hh.

In all Ridden Horse classes, the rider must be 15 years old or over.

Class 013 - Novice Horse (Riding Horse, Hunter, Cob), mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cm (14.2hh). These will not be ridden by the Judge.

Class 014 – Riding Horse, mare or gelding, 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cm (14.2hh). Open to riders 15 years and over.

Class 015 – Ridden Hunter, mare or gelding 4 years old & over exceeding 148cms (14.2hh). Open to riders 15 years and over.

Class 016 – Ridden Cob, mare or gelding 4 years old and over, exceeding 148cms (14.2hh). Open to riders 15 years and over.

Championship – 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 001-003, & 013-016 are eligible for the Ridden Horse Championship.

*H3 - CHAMPIONSHIP PRIZE - CENTRAL SADDLERY PERPETUAL TROPHY

*H4 – CHAMPIONSHIP PRIZE - THE EWAN M. BEATON TROPHY. A Perpetual Trophy presented to the winner of the RIDDEN HUNTER CLASS (class 015) in the RIDDEN HORSE SECTION.

MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND IN-HAND & RIDDEN PONIES – Ring 5

Judging will not commence before 12pm.

Judge – Mrs Liz Russell, Glasgow

Note: All Ponies in this section must be registered with the appropriate Breed Society.
All Stallions & Colts, two years old and over, must be in possession of a current appropriate Breed Society Stallion Licence

Highland Ponies are NOT eligible for the in-hand and ridden classes in the Mountain & Moorland Section as there is a separate Highland Pony Section. Except for Class 025 the NPS/Maggie May Junior Open ridden Championship Qualifier – Highlands may compete in this class.

Shetland Ponies are NOT eligible for the in-hand classes in the Mountain & Moorland Section as there is a separate Shetland Pony Section.

Shetland Ponies ARE eligible for their appropriate RIDDEN classes in the Mountain & Moorland section.

NPS SCOTLAND QUALIFIERS:

NPS Scotland/Townhead Pet n Pony In Hand Mountain & Moorland Championship.

Youngstock, stallions, mares and geldings registered in the main body of their respective Breed Society stud book.

OVERALL MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND IN HAND CHAMPIONSHIP In Hand M&M Championships: The Champion & Res. Champion in all Mixed pure-bred M & M or Breed Championships will qualify for the Final at the Scone Palace International Horse Trials on Friday 28th August 2026. Qualification may go to 3rd in the Championship (i.e. 1st Reserve Champion)

NPS Scotland/Kilmannan Stud Novice Ridden Mountain and Moorland Championship

Stallions, mares and geldings four years old and over, registered in the main body of their respective Breed Society stud book. A pony is not eligible to compete if, before 1st January in the current year, it has done any of the following:

- i) Won an open affiliated mixed M&M Ridden class
- ii) Qualified for Horse of the Year Show, LIHS or RIHS Open M&M Ridden classes
- iii) Qualified for the M&M Novice or Intermediate Ridden final at the NPS Summer Championship show and the NPS Scotland/Kilmannan Stud Novice Finals (N.B. Ponies can compete as novices in this competition for two consecutive years provided, they do not submit an entry to the final in the first year).
- iv) If a pony qualifies for Horse of the Year Show, LIHS or RIHS in its second year it is de-noviced and cannot compete in the Kilmannan Final at Scone Final.

A minimum of 6 ponies must be stripped in qualifying rounds. All ponies will be stripped in the Final.

The 2 highest placed ponies, not already qualified, in each class will qualify for the Final which will take place at the Scone Palace International Horse Trials on Friday 28th August 2026. Qualifications to go no lower than 4th place. This can be either mixed M. & M. or Breed Classes

NPS Scotland/Maggie May Junior Open Ridden Championship.

Mares and geldings four years old and over, registered in the main body of their respective Breed Society stud book.

Please note NO Stallions are allowed in the Junior Classes.

The two highest placed pony, in each Junior Ridden Class not already qualified, will qualify for the Final which will take place at the Scone Palace International Horse Trials on Friday 28th August 2026. Qualifications to go no lower than 4th place

NPS Scotland/Harbro Open Ridden Mountain & Moorland Championship.

Stallions, mares and geldings **four** years old and over, registered in the main body of their respective Breed Society stud book.

The 2 highest placed ponies, not already qualified, in each class will qualify for the Final which will take place at the Scone Palace International Horse Trials on Friday 28th August 2026. Qualifications to go no lower than 4th place.

NPS Scotland/ Craigclowan School M&M Lead Rein Championship

Ponies must be shown in a snaffle bit with the lead rein attached to the noseband. Ponies must not be cantered. Ponies may not be ridden side saddle. Handles on saddles are permitted. Ponies will not be stripped.

The 2 highest placed ponies in the Lead Rein Class not already qualified will go forward to the final which will take place at Scone Palace International Horse Trials on Friday 28th August 2026. Qualifications to go no lower than 4th place

NPS Scotland/ Craigclowan School M&M First Ridden Championship

Ponies must not be cantered except in their individual show. Ponies will not be stripped. Ponies may not be ridden side saddle. Ponies may be shown in any suitable bridle.

The 2 highest placed ponies in the First ridden class not already qualified will go forward to the final which will take place at Scone Palace International Horse Trials on Friday 28th August 2026. Qualifications to go no lower than 4th place.

Class 017 - M & M In Hand. Stallion, gelding, filly or colt, 3 years old & under. Dales, Fells, Connemara, New Forest & Welsh Section C & D.

Class 018 - M & M In Hand. Stallion, gelding, filly or colt, 3 years old & under. Welsh section A & B, Exmoor & Dartmoor.

Class 019 - M & M In Hand. Stallion, mare or gelding 4 years old & over. Dales, Fells, Connemara, New Forest & Welsh Section C & D.

Class 020 - M & M In Hand. Stallion, mare or gelding, 4 years old & over. Welsh section A & B, Exmoor & Dartmoor.

Championship – 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 017-020 are eligible for the Mountain & Moorland In-Hand Championship.

*H5 - CHAMPIONSHIP PRIZE- SHELL & BP FARM SERVICES PERPETUAL TROPHY – Awarded to the Champion in the M&M In-Hand section

*H6 - COLVILLE CIGARETTE BOX PERPETUAL TROPHY - for the highest placed In Hand Welsh Pony (A & B) exhibit in class 018.

Class 021 - Mountain & Moorland Lead Rein. Mares and geldings four years old and over not exceeding 122 cms, registered in the main body of the following Breed Society stud books: Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetland, New Forest, Welsh A and Welsh B. To be shown in a snaffle bit. Rider must be at least 3 years old on the day of the class and not to have attained their 9th birthday by the 1st January in the current year.

Class 022 - Mountain & Moorland First Ridden. Mares and geldings four years old and over not exceeding 128cms, registered in the main body of the following Breed Society stud books: Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetland, New Forest, Welsh A and Welsh B Riders not to have attained their 12th birthday by 1st January in the current year.

The Clydesdale Horse Society Shield

A Shield (which will be supplied and engraved by The Clydesdale Horse Society) will be awarded to the best yearling or two-year-old colt or filly, registered or eligible for registration with the Society, not having won a Shield before in its lifetime. The exhibitor must be a current member of The Clydesdale Horse Society.

Young Handlers Class

An engraved medal is presented by The Clydesdale Horse Society to the best young handler aged 12 to 16 on the day of the show who has not already qualified. That person will also receive a Young Handler qualifier rosette on the day of the show.

The capabilities of the handler are to be assessed, not the animal being led.

Qualifiers from any show held prior to 30th April in any year will qualify for the Young Handler final at the Royal Highland Show in the year of that show. Qualifiers after 30th April in any year will qualify for Young Handler Final at the following year's Royal Highland Show.

A merit rosette will be given to all entrants in the class. The James Bennett Fund generously sponsors the Young Handler Scheme and The Young Handler Final.

CHS Awards

The Clydesdale Horse Society Shield

As ever affiliation permits a Show to award a Clydesdale Shield to the best Clydesdale yearling or two-year old colt or filly that has not already won such a Shield in its lifetime. Please note for the avoidance of any doubt, that geldings cannot win this shield, nor can grade ups and colts out of grade up mares.

Please note (and new for 2026) that any horse with a clipped tail, subject to transitional arrangements if the tail was clipped in 2025, cannot win the Clydesdale Horse Society Shield. The background to this new rule is set out in a statement at the end of these Affiliation Rules.

Winners must be registered or in the process of being registered with CHS and exhibited by a current member of CHS.

Only current members of our Society can compete for a Shield. A Rosette is also awarded. In its lifetime each animal may only win one Shield and so the judge must choose the best eligible animal from non-Shield winners.

Young Handlers Class

Young Handlers must be aged 12 to 16 on the day of the qualifying show. Handlers may compete in any number of Young Handlers classes in any year / qualifying period, but they may only qualify once. If any handler placed in a class has already qualified in the period 1 May and up to 30 April then the qualifying place must go down the line to the first available non-qualifier.

Only animals that have already competed in the normal show or driving classes may be used. Entire colts are not allowed. Judging of this class is not to be on the merits of the animals – it is to be on the quality of the stockmanship and handling in the show ring by the Young Handler. Rosettes will be provided to all entrants by the CHS. Competitors should wear white coats, CHS ties and suitable footwear.

Please note that handlers may still compete in the final at the Royal Highland Show although they may be aged 17 by that point. The qualifying cut-off date is the actual day of the affiliated show.

Show Ring Etiquette

Exhibitors, handlers and their grooms must at all times present themselves in the show ring neatly and smartly dressed. For in-hand classes a white coat is recommended, with smart trousers or skirt with a shirt and tie. Appropriate footwear should be worn. Only two persons should be permitted in the show ring with each horse, namely the person leading the horse and one attendant for dressing out purposes. The attendant should also be smartly dressed.

Champion Clydesdale

A golden rosette will be given for the overall Clydesdale Champion. The winner is entitled to enter and participate in the Champion of Champions class at the Clydesdale Horse Society Winter Fair held in November. Upon submission of results, the winner will receive a note from the society confirming that they should enter the Champion of Champions class at the Winter Fair where the golden rosette should be worn.

Scone Palace Ridden Clydesdale Championship:

This class is a qualifier for the Ridden Clydesdale Championship to be held at Scone Palace International Horse Trials on Thursday 27 August 2026. The first two CLYDESDALES to qualify. Qualification may go down to fourth place, if horses placed 1st and 2nd have previously qualified. Registered Clydesdales and those eligible for registration may qualify and enter for the Championship.

Class 049 - Gelding, three years old and over

The 2 highest placed ponies, not already qualified, in each class will qualify for the Final which will take place at the Scone Palace International Horse Trials on Friday 28th August 2026. Qualifications to go no lower than 4th place.

Class 063- Stallion, two years old and over.

Class 064 – Yeld mare, four years old and over.

Class 065 - Gelding, four years old and over

Class 066 - Mare in foal or with foal at foot.

Class 067 – Colt or Filly foal.

Class 068 – Filly or gelding, two or three years old.

Class 069 - Yearling colt, gelding or filly.

Championship – 1st & 2nd prize winners in classes 063-069 are eligible for the Highland In-Hand Championship.

*H28 - CHAMPIONSHIP PRIZE - BALLINTON ROSEBOWL for best foal in classes 066 and 067. Presented by H.S McGregor. Reserve rosette.

*H29 - CHAMPIONSHIP PRIZE - SHIELHILL CUP presented in memory of the late Charles Rimmer for the Champion In-Hand Highland Pony. Rosette presented by the Highland Pony Society.

*H30 - JAMES CAIRNS ROSEBOWL, presented to the In Hand Highland Pony of the opposite sex to the Champion.

Class 070 - Novice Ridden Highland. Open to pure bred registered Highland pony stallions, mares or geldings, 4 years old and over. Must be shown in a snaffle bridle.

Class 071 - Open Ridden Highland. Open to pure bred registered Highland Pony stallions, mares or geldings, 4 years old and over.

Championship – 1st & 2nd prize winners in classes 070 & 071 are eligible for the Ridden Highland Championship.

*H31 - NIGHTLIGHT PERPETUAL TANKARD will be awarded to the Champion Ridden Highland Pony.

SHETLAND PONIES – Ring 3

Judging will commence at 9am.

Judge – Miss Ann Irvine, Aberdeenshire

This Show is affiliated to the Shetland Pony Society.

All exhibits entering must be registered with the Shetland Pony Society and are subject to the constitution and rules of this Breed Society.

Miniature Shetlands must not exceed 34”.

Classes must be confined to SPS-BS registered ponies. Ponies must be named on the entry form and in the catalogue if one is produced. Society rosettes must only be given to ponies registered with the Society or to foals eligible for registration.

Three-year-old fillies with foals at foot may not be shown. All foals must be a minimum of three weeks old on the day of the Show.

IN ORDER TO ENTER A STALLION CLASS AT AN AFFILIATED SHOW, ENTIRE MALES AGED 4 YEARS OLD AND OVER MUST HAVE AN "S" NUMBER AND HAVE BEEN SUCCESSFULLY THROUGH EITHER THE SPS-BS STALLION ASSESSMENT PRIOR TO 2006 OR THE CURRENT SPSBS VOLUNTARY VETERINARY EXAMINATION. Ridden stallions MUST display a stallion bridle badge. In hand colts/stallions of two years old or over must be shown bitted and are advised to display a colt or stallion bridle badge, these are available to purchase from the SPS-BS.

There must be no colts or stallions in Young Handlers classes. Young handlers must be a minimum of 3 years of age on the day of the show. Children under 14 years old may not show colts (excluding foals) or stallions in In-hand classes. Children under 12 years old on the day of the show may not show stallions in ridden classes. In the interests of safety, hard hats conforming to the current British Safety standards must be worn, correctly secured, by all handlers aged 14 years or under in In-hand classes. Exhibitors should not kneel but remain standing while in the ring. Hard hats conforming to the current British Safety Standards must be worn, correctly secured, by all exhibitors, irrespective of age, in ridden classes. Ridden and driven ponies must be 4 years old or over. In ridden classes, if a rider falls off at any time whilst in the ring, both pony and rider must leave the ring, rider dismounted, and take no further part.

Class 086 - Young Handlers.

This class will be split 7-11 years and 12-16 years old, if necessary.

All young handlers must wear hard hats.

Class 087 – Ridden Shetland Pony. Registered Shetland Pony, ridden by a child under 14 years of age, on or off the lead rein.

PRIVATE DRIVING – Main Ring

Judging will commence after the Ridden Clydesdale class in the Main Ring.

Judge – Mr Robert Robertson, Ayrshire

Doune and Dunblane Show is affiliated to the British Driving Society and the classes are run under The British Driving Society Rules.

The British Driving Society will give Champion, Reserve and Best Young Driver Rosette

The driver must be aged 8 years or over on the first day of the show at which they are to compete. A driver under the age of 18 must be accompanied in the vehicle by a competent and responsible person aged 18 years or over; a "responsible adult". Proof of age will be required if necessary. It is the responsibility of the owner/driver (if over 18) or (if the owner/driver is under 18) the responsible adult to ensure that his/her groom/s is/are competent for the purpose of attending to the turnout and aged 10 or over on the day of the show. When in the vehicle grooms, passenger/s and driver must have their feet firmly on the floor of the vehicle or use a suitable fixed footrest. This regulation applies at all times and in all areas on the showground.

All drivers/grooms/passengers under the age of 14 years must wear a correctly fitted hard hat when in a carriage or in attendance to a turnout.

These classes will be amalgamated if there are less than three entries in each class.

Class 088 – Open Private Driving

Open to Horse or pony, 4 years old or over, driven to a traditional or traditional type vehicle. A traditional vehicle means a vehicle of traditional profile and identifiable type to resemble the design of a carriage built prior to the First World War. The vehicle may be made from modern materials but must have traditional style springing and carriage lamps. Pneumatic tyred vehicles, trade turnouts and show wagons are not eligible.

Class 089 - Exercise Class

Open to horses & ponies, 4 years old or over. A single, pair or tandem driven to a carriage of non-traditional type design and includes those with pneumatic tyres specifically designed for carriages (i.e., not car tyres). Lamps need not be carried. Judging will include general cleanliness, safety of turnout, correct fitting of harness and vehicle suitability.

*H37 - CHAMPIONSHIP PRIZE - EDINAMPLE PERPETUAL VASE. Presented by the late DR J.H.C Watters

Society membership is not applicable; however, first aid is.

Classes will not begin before 1pm in Ring 3.

Class U1 - Tack & Turnout

Class U2 - Lead Rein Pony, 10 years & under

Class U3 - Beginners' Pony, 13 years & under

Class U4 - Ridden Pony, Rider 16 years & under, pony not exceeding 14.2hh

Class U5 - M and M ridden, any type, rider 16 or under

Class U6 - All Round Pony - any type, rider 16 & under. Open to lead rein ponies. Combinations will be asked to jump 2 small cross pole fences not exceeding 40cm.

Class U7 - Young handlers, 10 years & under

Class U8 - Young handlers, 11-16 years

Best Rider Championship - riders from classes U2, U3, U4 & U5 who received Best Rider Cards are eligible.

Class U9 - Fancy Dress (This will follow the Best Rider Championship).

Best Rider Championship - Rider to be chosen from classes U2, U3, U4, U5, & U6. Best rider cards will be given out in the aforementioned classes and riders will be called forward to compete for the Championship which will take place before the Fancy Dress class.
